COURSE DESCRIPTION

Students will advance in fluency and oral comprehension of more complex English sentences. Students will participate in oral comprehension exercises; will learn common American idioms and use them in conversation; they will also participate in class discussion of relevant subjects and present short prepared speeches.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

Students will speak English comfortably, pronouncing and enunciating words intelligibly. They will be able to comprehend what they say to each other and also what the teacher says. They will be required to demonstrate their progress through discussions and short public speeches.

METHODOLOGY

The course will include lectures, discussions and speeches relating any interesting, important or personal topic. Such discussions, naturally, will be interrupted by the teacher, with his corrections and explanations of correct and acceptable English speech.

EVALUATION

Students' progress, or lack of it, should be obvious to both the students and the teacher through the discussions and speeches. Quizzes will be conducted when appropriate.

GRADING

Discussions: 40%, Speeches: 40%, Quizzes: 20%

All results of oral performance will employ a numerical scoring system that is convertible to grades as indicated below.
